Collaborate to organize a classroom or school-wide activity

Work with your students, parents, parent liaison, HST/HPC Team members and Student Support Services Department staff: Nurse, Learning Support Professional, After School Coordinator, Tobacco Youth Outreach Coordinator/Peer Educators, Community Health Outreach Worker, and Wellness Coordinator.

- **Organize a Day of Silence:** April 15, 2011 event to acknowledge the discrimination and harassment faced in the LGBT community. Schools can consider a shorter period such as a moment of silence or a lunch period. Check the website for Day Of Silence Tips.
- **Contact a community based organization** such as Health Initiatives for Youth (HIFY) or Parents and Friends of Lesbians and Gays (PFLAG) to invite a speaker into your classroom: Review SSSD's website for more CBO information.
- **Host a School Wide Anti Slur or Gay Pride Poster Contest or Essay Contest**
- **Display Safe Place Posters** made by SFUSD students
